Sgt. Brett Moore >> In Toronto, the worst month for pedestrian involved collisions is November. Some of the contributing factors are changing daylight hours, and weather patterns, but the fact remains that poor decisions and the lack of attention lead to collisions, which are too often fatal.

Sgt. Brett Moore >> Recent trends show that regardless of the time of year, turning motor vehicles in intersections are striking pedestrians who have the right-of-way. We also see pedestrians crossing mid-block who are getting struck by vehicles, and senior members of our community are over-represented in fatal collisions.

P.C. Clint Stibbe >> Pedestrians, take a second look and ensure you make eye contact with drivers to ensure that you're being seen. Pedestrians, mid-block crossing or jaywalking is not illegal, but it is risky. Before you make a decision to step off the curb and onto the roadway ensure it's safe to do so. Make sure you have enough time to get across the roadway. Drivers, when driving in the city ensure you drive at or below the posted speed limits, ensure you are scanning for other vehicles, pedestrians or cyclists along your route, and do not be distracted.
